

CHAPTER 16

KIBBIE GRANT (SKILLED WORKFORCE SHORTAGE TUITION GRANT PROGRAM)

Overview

The Kibbie Grant Program provides need-based financial assistance to Iowa residents enrolled in career and technical education (CTE) programs at Iowa community colleges. Grants for full-time students are designed to cover one half of the average tuition and mandatory fees at Iowa community colleges, depending on the student's financial need and the amount of total funding available.

A. ELIGIBILITY

1. College

To be eligible to participate in the Kibbie Grant Program, colleges must be Iowa-supported community colleges. Students attending the following colleges are eligible to receive Kibbie Grant awards:

2. Student

In addition to the general eligibility requirements found in Chapter 1, eligible Kibbie Grant recipients must be admitted and in attendance in CTE programs of study of at least 15 weeks in length.

B. APPLICATION PROCESS

Students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as described in Chapter 1.

C. SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS

Eligible students must be enrolled and in attendance in programs of study defined by the Iowa Department of Education as CTE programs. Eligible programs of study are listed in Section I of this Chapter with corresponding Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) codes. CIP codes are reported by college administrators in the State Scholarship and Grant Reporting System for each Kibbie Grant recipient.

Workforce shortage programs (all of which are CTE programs) are compiled using information from the Iowa Workforce Development (IWD) Needs Assessment and recommendations put forward by the Iowa Community College Presidents. Workforce shortage programs are then matched to Title IV eligible programs of study at each Iowa community college by college administrators. Students who are required to complete arts and science classes as a part of their programs of study may have these classes included as eligible classes for Kibbie Grant funding.

Students who have not yet begun taking core CTE classes are not eligible to receive Kibbie Grants, as these students are not currently enrolled and in attendance in CTE programs.

Students who are enrolled in core Kibbie Grant classes, and have begun taking those classes, sometimes are enrolled in subsequent semesters during which no official core CTE classes are being attended. These students are making progress toward completion of their CTE programs and will be allowed to receive Kibbie Grants.

If a student enrolled in an identified Kibbie Grant shortage program subsequently withdraws from the core classes during that term of enrollment, the student remains eligible for the Kibbie Grant disbursement for that term of enrollment.

Students with Bachelors' degrees may receive Kibbie Grants if they enroll in eligible CTE programs at Iowa community colleges.

Grants are awarded to eligible students by college officials. Recipients must be on-time applicants (those meeting the Commission's July 1 priority deadline for 2016-17) whose EFC levels are within the parameters defined by the Commission. The Application Receipt Date on the student's Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR) MUST indicate that the student met the priority filing deadline.

Students must also demonstrate financial need, as defined by the Commission. The Kibbie Grant, in conjunction with the Federal Pell Grant and Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant, is designed to supplement total grant assistance by providing students with an amount of grant assistance approximately equal to the maximum Federal Pell Grant for a student with a \$0 Expected Family Contribution (EFC). However, a Kibbie Grant shall not exceed \$2,505 annually unless the student is attending in the summer. A visual graph of the awarding formula can be found in Section J this chapter.

D. AWARD AMOUNTS AND LIMITS

The maximum Kibbie Grant is \$2,505 for eligible Iowa students who enroll on a full-time basis during the 2016-17 academic year (minimum of 12 hours per semester or the quarter equivalent). Summer awards will be one-half of the academic year maximum grant award, or \$1,253 for students enrolled on a full-time basis. If a student receives full-time Kibbie Grants through the academic year and summer, the total Kibbie Grant award received for the year cannot exceed \$3,758.

Kibbie Grant awards are tuition/fee-restricted in nature. When awarded in combination with other tuition/fee-restricted funds, total tuition/fee-restricted funding that includes a Kibbie Grant cannot exceed total tuition and mandatory fees charged to the recipient. In most cases, the Kibbie Grant award is reduced to comply with this policy. For recipients of Chapter 33 veterans education tuition payments, the Kibbie Grant award should be applied to tuition and mandatory fees prior to the calculation of the Chapter 33 tuition/fee award.

If a student runs out of Pell Grant or Iowa Vocational-Technical Tuition Grant funding due to meeting or exceeding the cumulative lifetime limits, the Kibbie Grant award will not increase (Kibbie Grant awards will match the award schedule shown above).

E. AWARD NOTIFICATIONS

College officials should provide award notices to all Kibbie Grant recipients. Award notices must clearly indicate award amounts and the state programs from which students will benefit. All notices concerning state grants must include the following award notification statement:

“In the event that available state funds are insufficient to pay the full amount of each approved grant, the Iowa College Student Aid Commission has the authority to administratively reduce the award.”

The Commission understands that college officials begin notifying students of award amounts prior to the end of each year's Legislative Session. In order to minimize confusion and limit the workload at colleges and simultaneously be consistent with current legislation regarding award maximums, award notices must include awards at the current maximum.

F. RENEWAL ELIGIBILITY

Applicants may apply for a second year, and in some cases a partial third year, of Kibbie Grant awards. Generally, a recipient may receive up to 4 full-time semester awards, or the quarter equivalent. Although, students enrolled in CTE programs that require additional classes (including liberal arts classes) to complete the program, and who are making satisfactory progress toward completion of the program, may continue to receive Kibbie Grants for up to one additional semester of study if they are not able to complete the programs during the traditional two academic years of full-time enrollment (for a maximum of 5 semesters of full-time enrollment eligibility).

If students have received the maximum grant for two years, the students may regain eligibility after a two-year absence from the community college upon reentering a new program major (CTE programs).

G. CHANGES/CORRECTIONS

Any changes in awards must be provided to Commission staff electronically via the State Scholarship and Grant Reporting System (see Chapter 3 and Appendix A).

H. VERIFICATION/COMPLIANCE

College officials are responsible for completing required federal verification procedures and for coordinating all aid to ensure compliance with student eligibility and allowable award amounts.

For students selected for federal verification, one disbursement of state-funded student financial aid may be made prior to completing the verification process as long as college or university officials have no reason to believe application information is inaccurate. If students become ineligible for aid due to verification activities, refunds must be made to state-funded programs.

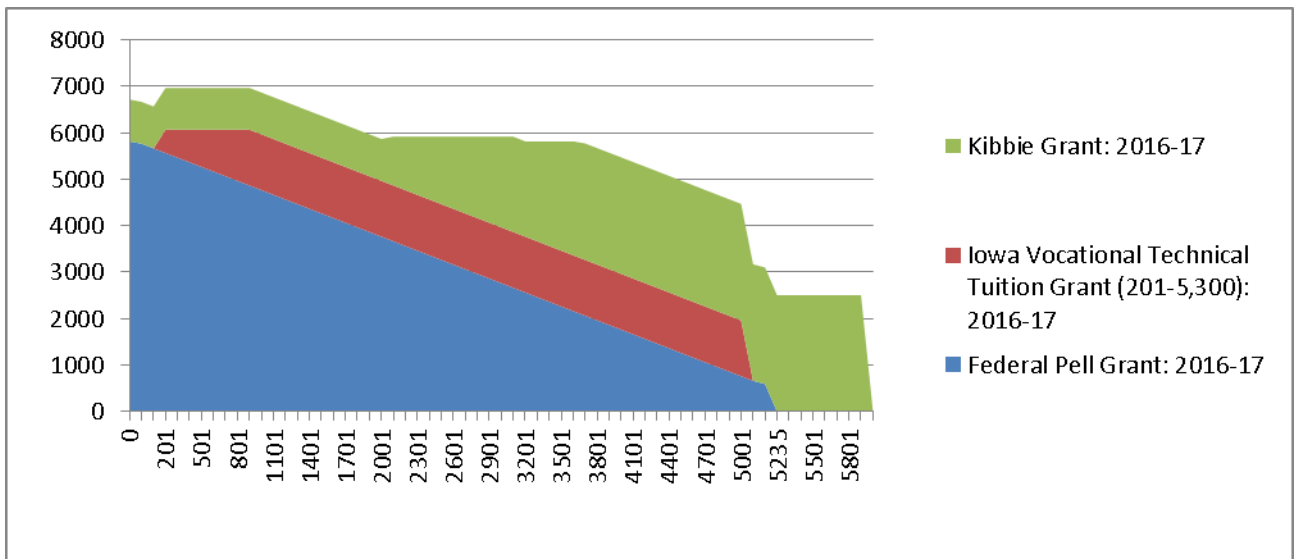
